#### 3. PETITIONS

#### 3. (i) New road layout around Blatchington Windmill - Councillor Janio

To receive the following petition signed by 132 people:

"A new road layout around Blatchington Windmill - Traffic flow around Blatchington Windmill is dangerous. We are requesting the Administration to please consider installing a new traffic layout in the area that is urgently required to alleviate the problems".

## 3. (ii) Traffic around Hangelton Primary School - Councillor Janio

To receive a petition signed by 125 people:

"We the undersigned demand that the Administration take urgent action to reduce the dangerous traffic situation around Hangleton Primary School during school pickup and drop-off times. Measures could include CCTV Systems and the use of PSPO's".

## 3. (iii) Traffic around Goldstone School - Councillor Janio

To receive a petition signed by 186 people:

"We the undersigned demand that the Administration take urgent action to reduce the dangerous traffic situation at Goldstone School during school pickup and drop-off times. Measures could include CCTV Systems and the use of PSPO's"
