

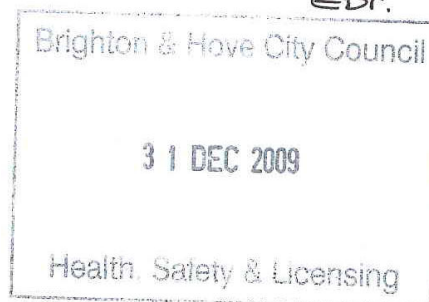

Dear Sirs,

Representation against the variation application under the Licensing Act 2003 for West Pier News, 133A Kings Road, Brighton, East Sussex, BN1 2HH.

Sussex Police object to this variation application made by Mr Ibrahim.

The basis of this objection is that the grant of the variation for this premises will not promote the licensing objectives. Particular reference being given to Cumulative Impact Policy, the prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance and protection of children from harm.

The premises is situated in Brighton and Hove's designated Cumulative Impact area and Sussex Police have concerns that the grant of this variation will give rise to potential negative cumulative impact.

The concentration of licensed premises within a small area of the City causes significant problems of anti social behaviour, crime and disorder and public nuisance. In consequence of this, after due consultation and consideration, on 13th March 2008 the Licensing Authority resolved that it was both appropriate and necessary to adopt a special policy in relation to cumulative impact in this area.

Mr Ibrahim has applied to extend the hours that the 'sale of alcohol by retail' applies from 0800 -2300 Monday to Saturday and 1000 – 2230 Sunday to 24 hours a day, Seven days a week.

Paragraph 2.4.5 Of the Brighton and Hove City Council statement of licensing Policy to the Licensing Act 2003 states:


Any variation application will potentially come within this special policy, including those for extension of hours, subject always to an applicant satisfying the authority that there will be no adverse effect on Cumulative Impact

Sussex Police contend that the granting of this variation will give rise to a likely negative Impact on Cumulative Impact.

Further to this, the applicant has failed to demonstrate that there will be '*no adverse effect on cumulative impact*'.

In view of the above, the licensing authority is invited to conclude that this application to vary the premises licence does not promote the licensing objectives and to refuse it.
