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#### Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- \$ 19; mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol
  - no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
  - every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence
- 4.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- S 21; mandatory condition: door supervision
- where a premises licence includes a condition relating to security activity, the licence must include a condition that each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority (there are exemptions re theatre and films and clubs).

#### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule:

#### For the Prevention of Crime and Disorder:

- 1. Digital CCTV will be installed operated and maintained in good working order throughout the premises internally and externally to a standard specification following consultation with Sussex Police providing constant monitoring and recording facility as agreed with Sussex Police. The system will store picture and sound for up to 31 days. The management will give full and immediate co-operation and technical assistance to the Police in the event that CCTV footage is requested for the prevention and detection of suspected or alleged crime.
- 2. All spirits will be kept behind the counter and beyond arms reach of customers.
- 3. The licence holder will become a member of neighbourhood watch and will join the Brighton Crime Reduction Partnership while these are in operation.

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4. The Premises will employ a mobile support unit, where all personnel carrying out security will be registered with the Security Industry Authority (SIA)

#### For Public Safety:

1. The shop front will be protected with metal shutters.

#### For the Prevention of Public Nuisance:

1. No loud music or noise will be allowed on the premises.


#### For the Protection of Children from Harm:

- 1. The premises will operate a 'Challenge 25' policy whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol who appears to be under 25 will be asked for photographic ID to prove their age. The only forms of ID that will be accepted are passports, driving licences with a photograph or proof of age cards bearing the 'PASS' mark hologram. The list of approved forms of ID may be amended or revised with the prior written agreement of Sussex Police and the Licensing Authority without the need to amend the licence or conditions attaching to it.
- 2. Suitable and sufficient signage advertising the 'Challenge 25' policy will be displayed in prominent locations in the premises.
- 3. All persons engaged, or to be engaged, in selling alcohol on the premises shall receive the following training in age-restricted sales:
  - Induction training which must be completed, and fully documented, prior to the sale of alcohol by the staff member; and refresher training thereafter at intervals of no less than 8 weeks.
  - All age-restricted sales training undertaken by staff members shall be fully documented and recorded. All training records shall be made available to Sussex Police and Brighton & Hove Trading Standards Service upon request.
- 4. The premises shall at all times maintain and operate an age-restricted sales refusals recording system (either in book or electronic form) which shall be reviewed by the Designated Premises Supervisor at intervals of no less that 4 weeks (and signed off and dated to confirm each review) and feedback given to staff as relevant. This refusals book shall be available upon request to police staff, Local Authority staff and Brighton & Hove Trading Standards.
