3. PETITIONS

3.1 Petitions referred from the Council meeting on 23 October 2014:

(i) Palestine

To receive the following petition signed by 412 signatures:

"We ask that the Council enters into no business with any firm or company originating from Israel or complicit in its occupation of Palestinian territories, and that it reviews all current contracts to ensure that any financial relationship with any such firm is ended as soon as lawfully possible."

(ii) Regency Square Hoteliers - West Pier Project

To receive the following petition signed by 12 signatures:

"The West Pier Project (WPP) provides supported/managed accommodation for up to 40 residents suffering from alcohol, drug abuse and mental illness. The WPP is close to shops selling cheap alcohol and a person suspected of dealing in drugs was recently arrested around the corner in Preston Street. The WPP residents attract friends who sit on the steps of the WPP and local hotels/buildings and also the nearby garden benches. These friends are often street drinkers.

The anti-social behaviour is seriously affecting our business and will also affect the popularity if the i360. We, the undersigned, believe the WPP is a serious contributory cause of ASB. We believe that the WPP should no longer house residents who are alcohol and drug dependent."
