




People receiving PCR test and positivity

Most recent days subject to reporting delay. Last available data: 24 January 2021


18th May – testing expanded to all aged 5+

Confirmed case rate




In the 7 days up to the 20 January there were 367 cases per 100,000 people – a decrease of 33% compared to the 7 days up to the 13 January.

Equivalent rate in England is 421 per 100,000 and for the South East 410 per 100,000.




Case rates: national comparison

Rate of confirmed cases per 100,000 population – 7 days to 20th of January




Case rates by age group

Age: case rate in aged 60 and over




60+ case rate per 100,000 people, Lower Tier LAs in South East, 7 day period to 20/01/2021
