The programme focuses on One Planet principles, particularly Zero Carbon, Sustainable Transport and Zero Waste. And encourages behaviour change both at work and at home, via a targeted approach based around Champions, campaigns and feedback on metrics to reinforce positive change. The University will make the resulting expertise and resources available to the project via a group of specially trained staff and students living in private sector housing in the target neighbourhoods. Activities will include: training of 'green champions' to spread the carbon-reduction message to their neighbours; use of university buildings for events; sharing of expertise (<i>the University is ranked 3rd out of 145 universities and higher education institutions in the People &amp; Planet's annual Green League 2012</i>).</p>
