

Primary School Places Consultation

Extra classes are being added to many schools across the Country in order to cope with a rapid rise in the birth rate particularly in the South East. Official figures show an extra 450,000 places will be needed in primary schools in England by 2015 particularly in London.* Brighton & Hove has identified a similar trend to other Authorities and has been working in recent years to expand schools in the areas of greatest demand.

Pupil numbers – the picture in Brighton and Hove

Analysis of projected pupil numbers shows that the number of pre-school children has grown to the point where more primary school places will be needed in Hove and at the Brighton/Hove border. With additional housing development also affecting numbers we anticipate that the need for places will be permanent and sustained.

To meet the projected future growth in primary pupil numbers we should be looking to provide a minimum of 120 places by 2015 in Hove, and a further 30 places in the south of Brighton by 2014.

The Council is therefore proposing:

1. To permanently expand the following primary schools from September 2013 by one form of entry (FE) each;
 - Stanford Infants (from 3 FE to 4 FE)
 - The Connaught Building, West Hove Infants (from 3 FE to 4 FE)
2. To permanently expand the following primary schools from September 2014 by one FE each.
 - St Marks Primary (from 1 FE to 2 FE)
 - Aldrington C.E. Primary (from 1 FE to 2 FE)
3. To permanently expand the following junior schools, should their relevant infant school be expanded as proposed above by one FE each.
 - Stanford Junior School (from September 2016)
 - ‘Connaught’ Junior School (from September 2017)

The Council will be consulting directly with the schools affected, and public meetings will be held at each school Where relevant the appropriate diocese will also be consulted.. In addition there will be three citywide public meetings held at:

The citywide public meetings will also include information related to future secondary provision and the review of secondary admissions catchment areas.
