# Hanover Communal Waste Collection Consultation Report

### Background

1367 information leaflets and questionnaires were sent to addresses in 20 roads in the Hanover area of the city in order to ascertain levels of support for improving refuse collection services by changing the scheme from weekly 'binvelope' / wheelie bin collection to on-street communal containers. In 2011 communal container refuse collection had been trailed in Coleman and Washington Street.

This consultation covers other areas of Hanover to assess levels of support for communal refuse collection. The results of this consultation will inform the decision on whether to roll out the scheme further.

#### Methodology

1367 leaflets and questionnaires were sent out to residential properties in the Hanover area. The leaflet set out how communal refuse collections would work, the advantages and disadvantages were listed and proposed locations of the communal containers were shown on a map. A questionnaire was enclosed for feedback. A copy of the leaflet was held on the council website with a link to an equivalent online version of the questionnaire.

One response per household was accepted (online or paper) and comments by email were also accepted and linked to questionnaire responses. Emails where full address information was given and where clear answers to the consultation questions were given were also included (from 5 households).

Several duplicate responses (35 paper and 48 online) were identified on the basis of address. Duplicates included those from individuals who had submitted more than one online response, an online response and a paper response or responses from different individuals within the same household. In each case, the duplicates were merged to form one record, with comments from both surveys counting, and the demographics information chosen randomly. In four cases, individuals from the same household had voted against each other. When selecting the record to use, the voting was alternated so that overall, and so the proportion of votes for and against remained the same. The merged duplicate records were treated as a single response. This left 42 records that had arisen from duplicate responses. All findings below treat these merged records as single responses and exclude the originals.

#### Headline results

- A total of 605 responses were received (Response rate: 44%). Responses were a mixture of paper (79%), online (20%) and direct emails (1%).
- 48% want to have communal bins (292 respondents), where as 46% want to keep the existing weekly collection (280 respondents).
- 50% of participants agreed with the proposed locations for the bins on the map, whereas 40% did not.
- The top concern was about the loss of parking spaces with 33%. This is followed by 24% who said it is not in keeping with the surroundings of their street. Followed by 16% who don't want bins outside their house and 6% who said the bins were too far from their house.
- Respondents were given the opportunity to give comments which were grouped into themes. The top comment was concern about loss of parking spaces, followed by concern about fly tipping and then not wanting a bins directly outside homes.

### Findings

In total 610 responses were received, 4 of these were emails (1%), 478 (79%) of these were completed questionnaires and 123 (20%) responses were received through the council's consultation portal. This gives an overall response rate of 44%.
