**3. (i)** Brighton Station and Seven Dials Proposals- Rob Heale

To receive the following combined paper petition and E-Petition signed by 63 people:

We believe that that some of the changes would endanger pedestrian safety, lead to more congestion and damage the environment. We therefore ask for further specific consultation about plans to remove the Safety Railings, replace
